BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

P.G. (Tim) Rooney graduated from the University of Alberta in 1949. After earning a Ph.D. from California Institute of Technology in 1952, he returned to Alberta as Lecturer and then Assistant Professor. He moved to the University of Toronto in 1955 as Assistant Professor, and rose rapidly through the ranks to become Professor in 1962. He is now Professor Emeritus.

Professor Rooney has published widely on Operator Theory and Fourier Analysis. His scholarly expertise was recognized in 1966, when he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada. In his time at Toronto he has supervised six Ph.D. students, four of whom now hold professorships at Canadian universities.

<p>From the time that he first joined the Canadian Mathematical Congress in 1952 to the present, Tim Rooney has been a very active member and an enthusiastic supporter of the Society's programs. Besides sitting on numerous committees over the years, he served on the Board (formally Council) for fourteen years, was Vice-President from 1979 to 1981, and President from 1981 to 1983. Previous to that he was Editor of the Canadian Journal of Mathematics from 1971 to 1975, and he served on the Editorial Board of the Journal for twelve years. BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

David Borwein did his undergraduate studies at the University of Witwatersrand, South Africa, and then obtained his Ph.D. under the direction of L.S. Bosanquet (whose own supervisor was G.H. Hardy) at the University of London in 1950. He was Lecturer in Mathematics at St. Andrews University, Scotland, from 1950 to 1963. In 1963 he visited the University of Western Ontario and subsequently took up a Professorship there. He was Head of Department from 1967 to 1989, when he was appointed Professor Emeritus.

Professor Borwein is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh. He has been active in the affairs of the Canadian Mathematical Society from the time of his

David Borwein joined the Canadian Mathematical Society in 1964, and has served it almost continuously in various capacities ever since. He was a member of the Board of Directors for fourteen years and of the Research Committee for eight, including four as its chairman. He served terms as Vice-President, as President and as a member of the Canadian Mathematical Olympiad Committee, the 1995 IMO Corporation and the National Committee for the IMU. For several years he edited the advanced problems section of the *American Mathematical Monthly* and recently he has been a judge at the Canada-Wide Science Fairs. In recognition of sustained and significant contributions to Canadian mathematical life, the CMS is pleased to present to Professor Borwein its Distinguished Service Award.
